### DAY-NRLM IN ANDHRA PRADESH

#### 3777. SHRI MASTHAN RAO BEEDA:

Will the Minister of Rural Development be pleased to state:

- (a) the aims and objectives of Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM);
- (b) the details of funds sanctioned/allocated during the last five years to Andhra Pradesh;
- (c) the number of rural poor households covered under the mission since its inception in Andhra Pradesh;
- (d) whether Government has conducted any assessment of the implementation of the scheme; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

#### **ANSWER**

# MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SADHVI NIRANJAN JYOTI)

- (a) The Ministry is implementing Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY NRLM) across the country (except Delhi & Chandigarh) with the objective of organizing the rural poor women into Self Help Groups (SHGs) and continuously nurturing and supporting them till they attain an appreciable increase in incomes over a period of time and come out of abject poverty. The Mission aims to reach out to 10 crore women from rural households by Financial Year 2023-24. As on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2023, the Mission has already mobilised approximately 8.93 crore women from rural households into 82.61 Lakh SHGs.
- (b) The details of funds allocated during the last five years to Andhra Pradesh under NRLM is given below:

- (c) As on 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2023 a total of 89,29,363 women from rural households have been mobilised into SHGs in the State of Andhra Pradesh.
- (d) & (e) Yes Sir, a study was conducted in 2019 to assess overall impact of DAY-NRLM by the International Initiative for Impact Evaluation (3ie). The evaluation indicates that an additional exposure to the Mission for 2.5 years led to:
  - i. Increase in income by 19% over the base amount.
  - ii. Decline in share of informal loans by 20%.
  - iii. Increase in savings by 28%.
  - iv. Improved labour force participation proportion of females reporting secondary Occupation is higher (4%) in treatment areas.
  - v. Improved access to other schemes significant increase in number of social schemes availed by treatment households (6.5% higher over the base value of 2.8 schemes.

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
