#### Allocation of funds by CPCB in the NCT of Delhi

#### 831. SHRI SANJAY SINGH:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) funds demanded by the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) in the NCT of Delhi and State Governments and allocated/released amount for the prevention of pollution during the last five years, year-wise;
- (b) whether any financial assistance or stubble removal machine has been provided to the farmers by the Central Government during the said period for the solution of the problem of stubble-burning; and
- (c) if so, the year-wise details thereof, if not, the reason therefor?

#### ANSWER

(a), (b), &(c):

Ministry of Environment Forest &Climate Change (MoEF&CC) launched National Clean Air Programme (NCAP)in January, 2019, with an objective to improve air quality in Nonattainment cities. It is a time-bound, national level strategy for prevention, control and abatement of air pollution in 131 cities across 24 States.

Funds released to NCT of Delhi under NCAP is enclosed at Annexure- I:

Central Government in 2018 launched the Scheme for 'Promotion of Agricultural Mechanization for In-Situ Management of Crop Residue in the States of Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh & NCT of Delhi, under which financial assistance is provided to the farmers for purchase of crop residue management machinery and establishment of custom hiring centres. 50% subsidy on the cost of crop residue management machinery is provided to the individual farmers and 80% subsidy is provided for establishment of Custom Hiring Centres (CHCs) of crop residue management machinery.

Rs.2440.07 crore have been released during the year from 2018-19 to 2021-22 using which, over 2 lakh crop residue machineries have been delivered to individual farmers and CHCs, and over 39,000 CHCs have been established.

Details of state-wise and year-wise funds provided for In-situ management of crops residue are provided at Annexure- II.

Details supply of crop residue management machines are provided at Annexure- III.
