NITI Aayog implements the Aspirational Districts (AD) Programme for improvement of socio-economic indicators in the selected districts. Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) supports all States/UTs in implementation of various schemes/initiatives for improvement of healthcare facilities under National Health Mission (NHM) based on the annual Program Implementation Plan (PIP) submitted by States/ UTs.

Aspirational Districts in general have shown improvement with respect to the Health and Nutrition indicators. District wise percentage achievement for Health and Nutrition theme, under the Programme as per Champions of Change Portal of NITI Aayog (as on 28th July 2023) is placed at **Annexure- I**

(c) As informed by NITI Aayog, the main strategy of AD program is based on convergence of existing schemes, which have their own funding arrangement. In order to foster competitive spirit and for addressing the critical gaps, additional allocation via challenge route is provided by NITI

Aayog. Every month, districts are assessed on the basis of monthly progress and the best performing Districts in overall terms and in each of the five sectors identified. The first and second rankers in overall terms are awarded Rs. 10 crores and Rs. 5 crores respectively. The first ranker from each of the five sectors including Health & Nutrition sector is awarded Rs. 3 crores each.

District wise details of fund allocated for healthcare facilities under the programme for the Health & Nutrition theme, as informed by NITI Aayog, is placed at **Annexure-II**.
