FOOD GRAINS AT FCI

1832 SHRI SANDEEP KUMAR PATHAK:

Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION be pleased to state:

- (a) number of States that have made requests to the Food Corporation of India (FCI) for extra food grains, in the last five years, details of all requests that were accepted and denied and the rate at which extra grains were supplied;
- (b) the quantity and price of each type of grain sold by FCI in domestic and global open market in the last five years;
- (c) quantity of grains at FCI that got rotten in last five years; and
- (d) the area of godown required, current space available with FCI and the plan for the required godowns?

- (a): The additional allocation of foodgrain in case of festivals, natural calamity and law & order situation is made at MSP/ MSP derived rate for wheat and rice respectively. In other cases, any additional allocation is made at Economic Cost subject to availability of foodgrains in the Central Pool. The details of additional allocation during last 5 years is enclosed at **Annexure-I.**
- (b): The details of quantity and reserve price of wheat and rice sold under Open Market Sale Scheme (Domestic) [OMSS(D)] during the last 5 years from 2018-19 to 2022-23 are enclosed at Annexure-III and Annexure-III.

In the last 5 years FCI has not sold/exported grain on the global open market on a commercial basis. However, FCI has provided stocks(wheat/rice) from the Central Pool stock through Ministry of External Affairs/ Nominated Agency for onward shipment to needy countries under humanitarian assistance /aid /donation in the last 5 Years. Details are enclosed at **Annexure-IV**.

(c): A very negligible quantity of food grains (wheat and rice) accrued as non-issuable (damaged) due to natural calamities like Cyclone, flood, rain etc. The year-wise detail of accrual of Non-issuable food grains against the off-take handled quantity by FCI is tabled below:

(d): The requirement of Storage capacity in FCI depends upon the level of procurement, requirement of buffer norms and Public Distribution System (PDS) operations for rice and wheat mainly. Storage gap is assessed in the procuring States based on the highest stock levels in the last three years and in the consuming States on the basis of 4 months (6 months in case of North Eastern states and in some other States/UTs like J&K, Ladakh, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Andaman & Nicobar and Lakshadweep) requirement of National Food Security Act (NFSA) and Other Welfare Scheme (OWS). FCI continuously assesses and monitors the storage capacity and based on the storage gap assessment, storage capacities are created/hired.

FCI augments its storage capacity through following schemes:-

- 1. Private Entrepreneurs Guarantee (PEG) Scheme
- 2. Scheme for Storage and Godowns.
- 3. Construction of modern Silos
- 4. Hiring of godown from CWCs/SWCs/State Agencies
- 5. Hiring of godown through Private Warehousing Scheme (PWS)

As on 01.07.2023, FCI has a network of 1923 of warehouses (Owned/Hired) with a capacity of 371.937 LMT for storage of Central Pool foodgrains.
