### FAME SCHEME

### 1875. SHRI RAGHAV CHADHA:

#### Will the Minister of Heavy Industries be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government acknowledges that two-wheeler EV makers have not received subsidies for 4.5 Lakh vehicles under Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Electric Vehicles (FAME-II), if so, steps that are being taken by Government in this regard;

(b) whether Government acknowledges that a sudden reduction of subsidy on electric twowheelers will lead to a major decline in EV adoption, if so, the reasons behind and the steps taken by Government;

(c) the details of the incentives provided to e-rickshaw drivers and whether Government plans to increase the subsidy for the same; and

(d) action taken by Government to conduct a comprehensive review of the FAME II scheme?

# ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR HEAVY INDUSTRIES (SHRI KRISHAN PAL GURJAR)

(a): Sir, the Ministry of Heavy Industries formulated Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Electric Vehicles in India Phase II (FAME India Phase II) Scheme for a period of five years commencing from 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2019 with a total budgetary support of Rs. 10,000 crore. This phase mainly focuses on supporting electrification of public & shared transportation, and aims to support through demand incentive 7090 eBuses, 5 lakh e-3 Wheelers, 55000 e-4 Wheeler Passenger Cars and 10 lakh e-2 Wheelers. In addition, creation of charging infrastructure is also supported under the Scheme.

Under phase-II of FAME India Scheme, 8,72,920 no. of electric vehicles amounting to Rs. 4267.00 Cr. (approx..) have been sold by the electric vehicle manufactures to consumers as on 02.08.2023 (as per <u>http://fame2.heavyindustries.gov.in/dashboard.aspx</u>). The details of sold electric vehicles category wise are as under:

Further, MHI sanctioned 6315 electric buses to 65 cities/STUs/State Govt. entities for intracity operations.

(b): Sir. The government has reduced the Electric Vehicle (EV) subsidy per unit to 15% of the ex-factory price from 40% for e-2Ws under FAME India Scheme Phase-II keeping in mind the increasing penetration of the EV market. This has been implemented after stakeholder's consultation meetings with OEMs of e-2W on 16.05.2023 and the approval of the Project Implementation and Sanctioning Committee (PISC) for FAME India Scheme Phase-II.

(c): Sir, under Phase-II of FAME-India Scheme, incentives are provided to buyers of erickshaw in the form of an upfront reduction in the purchase price of electric vehicles. The incentive is linked to battery capacity i.e. Rs. 10,000/KWh for e-3W with a cap 20 % of the cost of vehicle.

(d): Sir, at present, Government has no plan to conduct a comprehensive review of the FAME-II scheme.
