(a) to (e): The details of sanctioned and vacant posts of Majors and Captains (or equivalent) in Armed Forces are as under:

| Sl. <br> No. | Rank/Category | Sanctioned Strength | Vacant Posts |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 1. | Major (or equivalent) | 24,141 | 3,999 |
| 2. | Captain (or equivalent) | 15,632 | 6,278 |

The operational readiness and effectiveness of the Armed Forces is maintained with organizational resources. The available strength of Armed Forces personnel is sufficient to meet the current operational requirements.

The Government has undertaken various measures to fill the vacancies in the Armed Forces, which inter-alia include enhanced emphasis on improved Image Projection/Publicity in audio, visual, print, internet, social media, holding of career fairs, exhibitions, motivational lectures in schools and colleges, computer based online application filing etc.
