(c) & (d): Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 has been amended from time to time to incorporate new policy measures for minerals. The MMDR Amendment Bill 2023 has been passed by both Houses of the Parliament in the current session. The Amendment Bill proposes to introduce exploration licence, remove 6 minerals from the list of atomic minerals and empower the Central Government to auction mineral blocks of critical and strategic minerals.
