Vacancies of teaching and non-teaching posts in the Central University

2282. Shri V. Vijayasai Reddy:

Will the Minister of *Education* be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that 100 per cent vacancies are there in Central University of Anantapuram;
- (b) reasons for not filling the vacancies of teaching and non-teaching posts in the Central University (CU) of Anantapuram;
- (c) whether it is also a fact that despite having started academic work in the Anantapuram CU, it still does not have permanent building and campus;
- (d) whether the budget allocation to the said university is so meagre that there is not much progress in building a permanent campus; and
- (e) what steps Government is taking in expediting the filling up of vacancies and construction of permanent building for CU at Anantapuram?

ANSWER

(a) to (e): Occurring of vacancies and filling thereof is a continuous process. The onus of filling up such posts lies on Central University of Andhra Pradesh (CUAP), Anantapuram which is autonomous body created under Act of Parliament. Ministry of Education has given directive to CUAP to fill up vacancies in mission recruitment mode. As on date, out of 25 sanctioned posts (16 Teaching + 09 Non-Teaching), selection of 19 candidates (13 Teaching + 06 Non-Teaching) have been done by the University.

CUAP has started functioning from the temporary campus at Jawaharlal Nehru Technical University (JNTU), Anantapur. Government of India has sanctioned Rs.450 crore for the establishment of University, out of which Rs.105 crore has been released to University for the construction of permanent campus buildings so far.
