FUNDS ALLOCATED AND SPENT UNDER PMAGY

2378. DR. FAUZIA KHAN

Will the Minister of SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT be pleased to state:-

- (a) the funds allocated and spent under the Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojana (PMAGY);
- (b) the year-wise details of the number of villages as beneficiaries brought under the scheme in the past five years;
- (c) the details of the funds spent and work done in the Parbhani district of Maharashtra under the scheme; and
- (d) the details of the works done under the scheme such as drinking water and sanitation, education, health and nutrition, social security, rural roads and housing, electricity and clean fuel, agricultural practices, financial inclusion, digitization, livelihood and skill development, in the past five years, especially in Maharashtra?

ANSWER

(a) The scheme of Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojana(PMAGY) has since been merged with other 02 centrally sponsored scheme of this Department from 2021-22 and now been implemented as component of Adarsh Gram under the merged scheme of Pradhan Mantri Anusuchit Jaati Abhuyday Yojana(PM-AJAY). The details of fund sanctioned and utilised under the Adarsh Gram component of the scheme of PM-AJAY for the last five years is at **Annexure-I**.

(b). Under the Adarsh Gram component, the gaps identified in the selected villages get saturated against 50 monitorable indicators under 10 domains. The individual beneficiaries identified under this component, are not directly benefited from the fund released under the scheme, however, they get benefited through convergence with the schemes of other Department/Ministries. The year-wise details of number of villages covered and beneficiaries identified under the Adarsh Gram Component of the scheme is as following:

(c) In Parbhani district, a total of 06 villages have been covered under Adarsh Gram component, out of which VDP has been prepared in respect of 05 villages wherein 31 works have been identified, however no amount has been spent by the State Government.
