Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the Budgetary outlay for financial assistance of MSME sector, in last five years;
- (b) whether safety nets are being provided for MSMEs to withstand the financial stress of the global green transition trend;
- (c) whether there is greater credit flow into MSMEs that are endeavoring to transition from fossil fuel-based power sector value chain to greener sector value chain, if so, details thereof; and
- (d) whether Government has considered the positive impact of private green capital on MSMEs, if so, details of initiatives and schemes being implemented?

(a): The Budgetary outlay of Ministry of MSME during the last five years , is given at Annexure – I.

(b) to (d): To withstand financial stress, Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) was announced as a part of the AatmaNirbhar Bharat announcements. The Government of India is implementing Self Reliant India to infuse Rs. 50,000 crores equity in the potential MSMEs (Rs. 10,000 crores from GOI & Rs. 40,000 crores from Private Equity). Additionally , Ministry of MSME through various schemes, such as the Raising & Accelerating MSME Performance (RAMP), Lean, ZED, promoting Pilot Project Business Models for Increasing Penetration and Scaling up of Solar Energy (MSME- UNIDO -GEF project), promoting Market transformation for Energy Efficiency in Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME-UNIDO-GEF project) to provide assistance for adaption of green sector technology.
