"SALIANT FEATURES OF AYURSWASTHYA YOJANA"

482 SHRI PARIMAL NATHWANI:

Will the Minister of **AYUSH** be pleased to state:

- (a) The salient features of Central Sector scheme namely AYURSWASTHYA Yojana;
- (b) The total number of institutes benefitted by this scheme since implementation of the scheme, State/UT-wise; and
- (c) The details of funds allocated/disbursed to the selected beneficiaries under the scheme during the last three years, State/UT-wise?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF AYUSH (SHRI SARBANANDA SONOWAL)

(a) Sir, the Ministry of Ayush is running a Central Sector Scheme, namely AYURSWASTHYA Yojana having 02 components i.e. (i) AYUSH and Public Health (PHI) (ii) Centre of Excellence (CoE). The AYURSWASTHYA Yojana from Financial Year 2021-22.

Salient features of AYURSWASTHYA Yojana are as under:-

Objective of AYUSH and Public Health (PHI)

- i. To promote AYUSH intervention for community health care.
- ii. To demonstrate the advantages of AYUSH health care in public health.
- iii. To support for implementing Sustainable Development Goal-2 (SDG2) and Sustainable Development Goal -3 (SDG 3) through integrating AYUSH system.
- iv. Documentation of the efficacy of AYUSH systems through AYUSH interventions in various public health issues which can be taken up in larger scale for implementation in national health programmes

Objective of sub-component of AYUSH for Sports Medicine under the PHI component

i. Promote the use of AYUSH Interventions in sports medicine for promoting the health and fitness of sports persons.

ii. Promote AYUSH therapeutic interventions for the treatment of sports-related injuries and their rehabilitation.

Objective of Centre of Excellence (CoE)

- To support the establishment of advanced/ specialized AYUSH medical health units in reputed AYUSH and Allopathic institutions both in the Government and Non-Government sectors.
- ii. To support creative and innovative proposals for establishment and upgradation of both functions and facilities of reputed institutions to strengthen competencies of AYUSH professionals in education technology, research & innovation and such other fields necessary for promotion of AYUSH at national as well as international level.
- iii. To support creative and innovative proposals for prestigious organizations which have well-established buildings and infrastructure, and wish to work for AYUSH systems to the level of Centre of Excellence.

Funding Pattern:

Under the Scheme, financial assistance upto Rs.10.00 Crores and Rs.1.50 Crores are supported under Centre of Excellence (CoE) and AYUSH and Public Health component respectively. Further under Ayush for sports medicine, sub-component of Ayush & Public Health Component, financial assistance of Rs.1.00 Crore is supported.

Under AYUSH and Public Health and Centre of Excellence (CoE) components, fund are provided for three (03) years in three (03) installments viz. 40%, 40% and 20%. Under the subcomponent of Ayush for sports medicine, fund is released for 18 months in two installment at the rate of 60% and 40%.

(b) and (c) The scheme is implemented since FY 2021-22. Under the scheme, funds are directly released to the eligible organizations/institutes based on the merit of the proposals as per the provision of Scheme guidelines and not allocated to the States / UTs-wise. Under the scheme, 24 institutes/organizations have been supported out of which, projects of few organizations were approved for financial assistance under erstwhile Central Sector Scheme namely i) Promotion of AYUSH Intervention in Public Health Initiatives (PHI) and ii) Central Sector Scheme for assistance to AYUSH organizations (Government / Non-Government Non-Profit) engaged in AYUSH Education/Drug Development & Research / Clinical Research etc. for upgradation to Centre of Excellence (CoE), which have been merged under Ayurswasthya Yojana.

The details of the fund allocated/disbursed to the organizations/institutes under the AYURSWASTHYA Yojana since its implementation are placed at **Annexure-I.**
