#### **Death of Cheetahs**

### 55. SHRI VIVEK K. TANKHA:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Ministry has investigated reasons for the death of 6 Cheetahs so far;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (c) the steps that are being taken to mitigate deaths and sustain their population?

### **ANSWER**

(a) & (b) As reported by the State, the details of Cheetah deaths are given below:

- 3 Indian born cubs of nearly 2 months of age died on 23.05.2023 due to heat stroke.
- (c) A detailed scientific action plan has been prepared as per IUCN Guidelines for introduction of Cheetah in India. As per the Action Plan, Kuno National Park, Nauradehi wildlife sanctuary and Gandhi Sagar wildlife sanctuary in Madhya Pradesh and Shahgarh Bulge, Bhainsrorgarh wildlife sanctuary and enclosure in Mukundara Hills Tiger Reserve in Rajasthan are the potential sites identified for cheetah introduction. Cheetah introduction in these sites depends upon the continued availability of cheetahs from African countries for sourcing as well as the status of habitat, prey base and protection mechanism on the ground.
