JOHN BRITTAS ANSWERED IN RAJYA SABHA ON 15.12.2023 REGARDING INTRODUCTION OF MORE AC COACHES IN LIEU OF NON-AC COACHES (a) to (c) To cater to the needs of General Class passengers, the extant policy pertaining to the composition of Mail/Express services provide for 12 General & Sleeper non-AC coaches and 08 AC-Coaches in a train of 22 coaches, thereby providing for greater accommodation for passengers using General & Sleeper non-AC coaches. Moreover, the number of General & Sleeper (non-AC coaches) comprises about two-third of the total holding of coaches.
