**STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO RAJYA SABHA  
STARRED QUESTION NO. 180 \* FOR 19<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER, 2023**

(a) The Kayakalp scheme was launched by the Minister of Health and Family Welfare on 15th May 2015 to complement the efforts of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan to promote cleanliness in public spaces. It is a national initiative to recognize and incentivize such public health facilities which demonstrate high levels of cleanliness, hygiene, and infection control.

**Objectives of the Kayakalp scheme:**

1. To promote cleanliness, hygiene and Infection Control Practices in public Health Care Facilities.
2. To incentivize and recognize such public healthcare facilities that show exemplary performance in adhering to standard protocols of cleanliness and infection control.
3. To inculcate a culture of ongoing assessment and peer review of performance related to hygiene, cleanliness and sanitation.
4. To create and share sustainable practices related to improved cleanliness in public health facilities linked to positive health outcomes.

The Scheme is operational at two levels:

- (A) Public Health Facilities upto District Hospitals;
- (B) Central Government Hospitals.

The Kayakalp assessment is a three-tier process involving internal, peer and external assessment. At the beginning of each financial year, health facility is assessed, scored and documented using the pre-defined assessment tool.

(A) For Public Health facilities upto district Hospitals, the assessment tool has a checklist arranged around eight thematic areas as mentioned below:

1. Hospital/Facility Upkeep
2. Sanitation and Hygiene
3. Waste Management
4. Infection Control
5. Support Services

6. Hygiene Promotion
7. Cleanliness beyond hospital boundary wall
8. Eco-friendly facility

(B) For Central Government Hospitals, the assessment tool has the following thematic areas:

1. Hospital Upkeep
2. Sanitation and hygiene
3. Support Services
4. Waste Management
5. Infection Control
6. Hygiene Promotion
7. Feedback Mechanism from Public on Cleanliness

(b) The number of Kayakalp facilities increased from FY 2015-16 to FY 2021-22 is as under:

(A) Public Health Facilities upto District Hospitals- increased from 97 in FY 2015-16 to 13915 in FY 2021-22. Details are at **Annexure-I**.

(B) Central Government Hospitals - Details are at **Annexure-II**.

(c) A new thematic area, Eco-friendly facility was added in the criteria for public health facilities upto District Hospital in 2021-22.

(d) Kayakalp scheme is an "incentive scheme". Details of incentives disbursed across District Hospitals, Primary Health Centres, Urban Primary Health Centre Services, Urban Community Health Centres and Health & Wellness Centres is at **Annexure-III**.
