- (a) the number and name of tiger reserves having zero or one tiger only;
- (b) the details of the number of tiger deaths during the last three years, State-wise and year-wise;
- (c) the reasons for tiger deaths viz., due to accident, conflict, poaching, etc;
- (d) the number of cases recorded regarding seizure of tiger body parts since 2019; and
- (e) the number of cases of poaching registered and people arrested, State-wise and year-wise?

# STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a), (b), (c), (d) & (e) OF THE RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 200 ON DEATHS OF TIGERS IN TIGER RESERVES DUE FOR REPLY ON 21.12.2023

- (a) As per the 5<sup>th</sup> cycle of the All India Tiger Estimation, 2022, 5 tiger reserves namely the Sahyadri, Satkosia, Kawal, Dampa and Kamlang Tiger Reserves recorded no tigers while 7 tiger reserves recorded one tiger each namely Buxa, Namdapha, Mukundra Hills, Ramgarh-Vishdhari, Palamau, Udanti-Sitanadi and Indravati Tiger Reserves.
- (b) As reported by States, the details of tiger deaths over the last three years is as follows:
