(a) The Kayakalp scheme was launched by the Honorable HFM on 15th May 2015 to complement the efforts of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan to promote cleanliness in public spaces. It is a national initiative to recognize and incentivize such public health facilities which demonstrate high levels of cleanliness, hygiene, and infection control. Cleanliness and hygiene in the health facilities are critical for controlling infections, and also providing patients and visitors with a positive experience. It also encourages moulding behaviour related to clean environment.

Objectives of the Kayakalp scheme:

1. To promote cleanliness, hygiene and Infection Control Practices in public Health Care Facilities.
2. To incentivize and recognize such public healthcare facilities that show exemplary performance in adhering to standard protocols of cleanliness and infection control.

3. To inculcate a culture of ongoing assessment and peer review of performance related to hygiene, cleanliness and sanitation.
4. To create and share sustainable practices related to improved cleanliness in public health facilities linked to positive health outcomes.

The Scheme is operational at two levels:

- (A) Public Health Facilities upto District Hospitals;
- (B) Central Government Hospitals.

- (b) The number of Kayakalp facilities grown from FY 2018-19 to FY 2022-23 is as under:
 - (A) Public Health Facilities upto District Hospitals- increased from 4820 in FY 2018-19 to 20,336 in FY 2022-23. Details are at **Annexure-I**.
 - (B) Details of Central Government Hospitals are at **Annexure-II**.
- (c) No additional themes added in the FY 2023-24.
- (d) Kayakalp scheme is now an "incentive scheme". Details of incentives disbursed across District Hospitals, Primary Health Centres, Urban Primary Health Centre Services, Urban Community Health Centres and Health & Wellness Centres is at **Annexure-III**.
