WOMEN AND CHILDREN TRAFFICKING

1184 SHRI TIRUCHI SIVA:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the number of cases of trafficking of women and children is increasing in the country in the last five years, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the number of trafficked women and children who have been successfully traced in the last five years, State-wise;
- (c) whether Government has set up trauma, therapy and rehabilitation centres to help those who are abducted and traced; and
- (d) whether Government has set up any livelihood training programs for such victims, if so, the details thereof, State-wise?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI AJAY KUMAR MISHRA)

(a): The National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) compiles crime statistics reported to it by the States and Union Territories (UTs) and publishes the same in its annual publication 'Crime in India'. The latest published report is of the year 2022. The data on the number of cases registered under human trafficking during the last five years do not show any consistent trend of increase in the numbers.

- (b): State/UT-wise number of women and children rescued under Human Trafficking during the years 2018 to 2022 are given in Annexure-I.
- (c) &(d): The Ministry of Women and Child Development has informed that "SwadharGreh" for Women in difficult circumstances and 'Ujjawala Homes' for Prevention of Trafficking have been merged and are now known as 'Shakti Sadan', which is an Integrated Relief and Rehabilitation Home for the women in distress situations and difficult circumstances. The residents of Shakti Sadan are provided with shelter, food, clothing, counseling, primary health facilities, vocational training etc. in convergence with other Departments.
