CONNECTIVITY IN REMOTE AREAS OF UNION TERRITORY OF LADAKH

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether connectivity of remote areas of Union Territory of Ladakh to its headquarters is available during winters; and
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken by Government to keep these areas connected to the headquarters during winters?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI NITYANAND RAI)

- (a):The areas within Ladakh remain connected with the Headquarters during winters except some instances when there is heavy snow fall.
- (b): The Union Territory(UT) of Ladakh has taken several steps to keep all the remote areas connected to the Headquarters during winters, such as
 - i. The Public Works Department has been equipped with all required machineries like snow clearance machines, hydraulic cranes, recovery vehicles, workshop vans.
- ii. Adequate manpower has been provided in both the Districts of Leh and Kargil for snow clearance.

- iii. 140 machines have been procured for snow clearance.
- iv. An agency has also been hired for deployment of private machines in snow clearance as and when required.
- v. The roads maintained by Border Roads Organization (BRO), are being kept open by BRO during winters.
- vi. Due to prompt snow clearance, the Kargil–Zanskar road was closed only for 23 days in 2022-23 as compared to 154 days in 2019-20 and the Zozila road was closed for 70 days only in 2022-23 as compared to 127 days in 2019-20.
- vii. 114 Km new roads and 22 new bridges have been constructed in rural areas to improve the connectivity since 2019.
- viii. 30 helipads have been constructed since 2019 for operation of helicopters.
