NEW ENTERPRISES IN THE COUNTRY

1260. SHRI A. A. RAHIM:

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:-

- (a) the number of new enterprises formed in the last financial year;
- (b) the number of enterprises formed by women entrepreneurs in the last two financial years, State-wise details thereof; and
- (c) the States which showed best practices or exemplary efforts in this regard?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

(SHRI RAJEEV CHANDRASEKHAR)

(a) to (c) Under the Government of India's Skill India Mission (SIM), the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) delivers skill, re-skill and up-skill training through an extensive network of skill development centres/colleges/institutes etc. under various schemes, viz. Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS), National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) and Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), to all the sections of the society across the country. The SIM aims at enabling youth of India to get future ready & industry ready skills.

I. The details of the various initiatives/programmes undertaken by Ministries/Departments of the Government for development of Women Entrepreneurs across the country are as under:

(i) **Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD)** is implementing two welfare schemes in the field of skill development for rural poor youth under the National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM) for gainful employment and to eradicate poverty which is as under:

- (a) DDU-GKY is a placement linked skill development program for rural poor youth in the age group of 15-35 years. DDU-GKY guidelines provide for earmarking 50% of the funds for SCs and STs and 15% for minorities. Further, one third beneficiaries of the respective categories including general category covered under the scheme should be women.
- (b) Skill development through Rural Self Employment Training Institutes (RSETIs) enables a trainee to take Bank credit and start his/her own Micro-enterprise. Some of such trainees may also seek regular salaried jobs. Under the RSETI scheme, 591 RSETIs are functioning in 577 districts of 33 States & and UTs across the country. These RSETIs are extending free-of-cost skill and entrepreneurship Development training to rural unemployed youth to enable them to become self-employed by commencing their own micro-enterprises.

The State-wise details of total number of new enterprises formed by candidates trained under RSETI including details of new enterprises formed by women entrepreneurs during 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24 (upto 31.10.2023) is at **Annexure-I, Annexure-II** and **Annexure-III** respectively.

(ii) **Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME)** through Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC), is implementing Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) for assisting entrepreneurs across the country in setting up of new units in the non-farm sector. It aims to provide employment opportunities to traditional artisans/ rural and urban unemployed youth at their doorstep. Under PMEGP, General Category beneficiaries can avail Margin Money subsidy of 25% of the project cost in rural areas and 15% in urban areas. For beneficiaries belonging to Special Categories, such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, OBCs, Minorities, Women, Transgenders, Ex-servicemen, Differently Able, beneficiaries belonging to Northeastern Region, Aspirational District, Hill and Border areas, etc., the Margin Money subsidy is 35% in rural areas and 25% in urban area. The maximum cost of project is Rs.50 lakh in the manufacturing sector and Rs.20 lakh in the service sector. Also, own contribution for beneficiaries belonging to Special Categories which includes Women is 5% of project cost as compared to 10% for General Category beneficiaries. During FY 2022-23, 85,167 units were assisted with Margin Money subsidy under PMEGP. The state-wise details of Women-owned enterprises assisted across the country during 2021-22 and 2022-23 under PMEGP along with the performance of States/UTs in terms of percentage of women-owned enterprises against total units assisted are at **Annexure-IV and Annexure-V** respectively.

The data relating to the number of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises owned by women maintained by M/o Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises under Udyam Registration (UR) during the last two years is given at **Annexure-VI**.

(iii) **Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY)** was launched on 08.04.2015 to extend collateral free credit up to Rs.10 lakh by Member Lending Institutions (MLIs), i.e., Scheduled Commercial Banks (SCBs), Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs) and Micro Finance Institutions (MFIs). Any individual, who is otherwise eligible to take a loan and has a business plan for small business enterprise can avail loan under the Scheme for income generating activities in the manufacturing, trading, service sectors including activities allied to agriculture across three loan categories, viz. Shishu (loans up to Rs. 50,000/-), Kishor (loans above Rs. 50,000/- and up to Rs. 5 lakh) and Tarun (loans above Rs. 5 lakh and up to Rs. 10 lakhs. A total of 6.23 crore loans have been extended under PMMY, during the last financial year. A total number of 8.26 Women Entrepreneurs have been sanctioned loans under the Scheme in last two financial years. The state-wise data of Women Entrepreneurs for the last two financial years is at **Annexure-VII**.

(iv) **Stand-Up India (SUPI) Scheme** launched on 05.04.2016 has been extended up to the year 2025. The objective of the Scheme is to facilitate loans from Scheduled Commercial Banks (SCBs) of value between Rs. 10 lakh and Rs. 1 crore to at least one Scheduled Caste (SC) or Scheduled Tribe (ST) borrower and one Women borrower per bank branch for setting up greenfield enterprise in manufacturing, services or trading sector including activities allied to agriculture. Stand-Up India scheme has facilitated 38,105 loans to SC/ST and Women entrepreneurs across the country in the last financial year. A total number of 49,084 Women Entrepreneurs have been sanctioned loans under the Scheme in the last two financial years. The state-wise data of Women Entrepreneurs for the last two financial years is at **Annexure-VIII**.

(v) **Ministry of Women & Child Development** implements 'Mission Shakti' –an integrated women empowerment programme as umbrella scheme for safety, security and empowerment of women. The Umbrella Scheme of Mission Shakti has two sub-schemes namely "Sambal" and "Samarthya". 'Samarthya' sub- scheme, has a component i.e. Hub for Empowerment of Women (HEW) at National, State and District levels for Empowerment of Women. HEW aims to facilitate inter-sectoral convergence of schemes and programs meant for women at the Central, State/ UT and district levels with the mandate to create an environment in which women realize their full potential. The support under the HEW is for guiding, linking and hand holding women to various institutional and schematic set ups for their empowerment and development including facilitating access to healthcare, quality education, career and vocational counseling/ training, financial inclusion, entrepreneurship, backward and forward linkages, health and safety for workers, social security and digital literacy at districts/ Blocks/ Gram Panchayats level across the country.

(vi) **Department of Science and Technology** implements various components under an umbrella program National Initiative for Developing and Harnessing Innovations (NIDHI) like Technology Business Incubators (TBIs), Seed Support Program (SSP), Promoting and Accelerating Young and Aspiring Innovators and Startups

(PRAYAS), Program etc. to support all entrepreneurs, where women led startups and innovators are also encouraged to apply and seek support for entrepreneurship.

II. Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) through National Institute for Entrepreneurship and Small Business Development (NIESBUD) and Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE), Guwahati has been working for the empowerment, upliftment and development of women entrepreneurs across the country. MSDE has taken various initiatives towards promotion of women entrepreneurship across the Country. The details of the various initiatives taken by MSDE are as under:

(i) Strengthening Entrepreneurial Climate through Capacity Building, Incubation Support, Mentoring and Handholding sanctioned under SANKALP Scheme

NIESBUD is implementing the project for strengthening the entrepreneurship ecosystem to different sections of the society including marginalized population with the support of SANKALP Programme of the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE). A total of 13987 women beneficiaries have been covered in the project through capacity building interventions.

(ii) Entrepreneurship Development among Jail Inmates

MSDE is implementing a project for Promoting Entrepreneurship Development among Jail Inmates through NIESBUD. The project has been implemented in the Nari Bandi Niketan, Lucknow, Model Jail, Lucknow and Central Jail, Varanasi. A total of 140 women beneficiaries have been trained in the project.

(iii) Organising Workshops in Artisan Melas And Haats

NIESBUD is implementing a project supported by the MSDE for organising workshops for capacity building and providing entrepreneurial knowledge to the artisans during the Melas and Haats. A total of 342 women beneficiaries have been covered in the project.

(iv) Creating Entrepreneurial Climate through Training of Trainers and Entrepreneurship Development Programme in Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS)

NIESBUD is implementing a project for Creating Entrepreneurial Climate through Training of Trainers and Entrepreneurship Development Programme in Jan Shikshan Sansthans (JSS). A total of 1105 women JSS Trainers have been trained in the project through Trainers Training Programme on Employability, Entrepreneurship and Life Skills. Further, a total of 3666 women JSS Trainees have been trained in the project through Entrepreneurship Development Programme.

(v) Pilot Project for Entrepreneurship Development Program

NIESBUD has implemented a Pilot Project for Entrepreneurship Development Program in 10 States sponsored by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship which aims at creating, fostering and promoting the spirit of entrepreneurship among the target groups through Entrepreneurship Development Programme, Mentoring and Handholding support. A total of 3089 women participants have been trained in the project.

(vi) Pilot Project on Entrepreneurship Development in Holy Cities

NIESBUD has implemented the pilot project on Entrepreneurship Development in Holy Cities at Varanasi, Haridwar and Pandharpur. The primary objectives of the project was to catalyse the entrepreneurial activities of the temple town through resumption of existing livelihood activities and by supporting existing enterprise to scale up and to tap the potential entrepreneurs, mentoring them to identify, set up enterprises and management of the enterprises. A total number of 5719 female participants have been trained through the project in three project locations.

(vii) Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE), Guwahati has established incubation centres dedicated to nurturing and supporting women-led startups. The centers provide a conducive environment for ideation, innovation, and early-stage development. They offer resources such as shared office spaces, access to technology, and networking opportunities, fostering a collaborative ecosystem that propels women entrepreneurs towards success. Additionally, financial linkages are being provided to women entrepreneurs to alleviate initial capital constraints. The following projects/ programmes are being undertaken by IIE for promotion of entrepreneurship among women:

- a. The Institute has undertaken various programmes under Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Vikas Mission (PMJVM) formerly known as Pradhan Mantri Van Dhan Yojana (PMVDY), that benefits women to be financially independent. Women have been motivated to learn various trades offered through the PMVDY scheme and start their own entrepreneurial journey thereby improving the livelihood of these women from different tribal communities. Under the PMVDY scheme, a fund of Rs. 2,40,000 as working capital is provided to every cluster, with the help of which the beneficiaries can purchase raw materials and other necessary items required to start a business on their own. Also additional supporting funds are allocated and distributed per cluster to facilitate renovation, increase storage space to ensure maintenance of mandatory compliances and for electricity power connections.
- b. Cluster development projects undertaken to regenerate traditional artisanal activity: In the North East Region, the Ministry of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) is actively leading the regeneration and revitalization efforts for women-led clusters through the implementation of the Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI). SFURTI is designed to breathe new life into traditional industries by offering crucial support, including financial assistance, capacity building, design development, product development support, capacity building, market linkage supports and technological upgrades. IIE Guwahati has been implementing 61 Projects of cluster development under SFURTI in various states of Northeastern Region, West Bengal, Bihar, Orissa and Uttarakhand. The key focus is in Northeastern Region and women beneficiaries who have taken one step out of their households to form collectives to create enterprise opportunities. Out of these 61 clusters, 30 clusters are primarily women-led, cutting across various sectors like Handloom traditional textile, dress making, bamboo craft and other crafts, food processing, toy making. Through the 61 clusters 30,054 beneficiaries were benefited. Out of these 30,054 beneficiaries of SFURTI Programme implemented by IIE, 17,759 beneficiaries are women which is approximately 59 percent.
- c. Technological interventions have enabled women artisans to increase their skills and productivity to make contemporary products out of traditional skills and designs. Some women-led clusters developed by IIE have also been able to export products directly from Nagaland, enabling them earn better income and livelihoods. Such enterprising efforts are driven by women-led SPVs (Special Purpose Vehicles) which run and manage the enterprise activities. They have also developed their own brand and distinct identity with the support provided by the Government.

(viii) Economic Empowerment of Women Entrepreneurs and Start-ups by Women (WEE) project was supported by 'Deutsche Gesellschaft fur Internationale Zusammenarbeit' (GIZ) on behalf of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) in partnership with the MSDE to improve the framework conditions for women-led enterprises in India. WEE project was launched by the MSDE in 2018, initially for duration of 3 years (2018-2021) which was further extended for one year to July, 2022. The project aimed to pilot incubation and acceleration programmes for women micro entrepreneurs, enabling them to start new businesses and scale up existing enterprises in the States of Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, and Eight North Eastern States of the Country. Under the title of 'Her & Now', the WEE project had carried out a film and media campaign to share the stories of successful Women Entrepreneurs and to foster a positive mindset change on gender roles and norms in the society. Over 908 Women Entrepreneurs were supported under the project under both incubation and acceleration support programmes.
