**BENEFITS OF PLI SCHEME TO ELECTRONICS MANUFACTURING
COMPANIES**

1522. SHRI M. MOHAMED ABDULLA:

Will the Minister of ELECTRONICS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of large-scale electronics manufacturing companies that benefitted from the PLI scheme, State-wise, and year-wise;
- (b) amount of funds allocated and disbursed as subsidies to the large-scale electronics manufacturing companies under the PLI scheme, State-wise;
- (c) whether Government really care about the genuine manufacturing of electronic goods particularly mobile phones within the country rather than only assembling them; and
- (d) If so, the percentage of companies avail benefits from the PLI scheme for genuine manufacturing;

(a) to (d): To boost domestic manufacturing and attract investment in mobile phones value chain including electronic components and semiconductor packaging, Production Linked Incentive Scheme (PLI) for Large Scale Electronics Manufacturing (LSEM) was notified on 01.04.2020. 32 applicants are approved under the Scheme. 16 companies were approved in Round-1 (10 companies for Mobile Phones (5 Domestic and 5 Global) and 6 companies for Specified Electronic Components), and 16 companies were approved in Round 2 for Specified Electronic Components. Mobile production has increased from Rs 18,900 crores in 2014-15 to Rs 3,50,000 crores in 2022-23. From about 78% import dependence in 2014, India has reached a stage where 99.2% of all mobiles sold in India are 'Made In India'.
