FINANCIAL DISTRESS IN THE INDIAN AVIATION INDUSTRY

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:-

- (a) details of both international and domestic airlines that have exited the aviation market due to financial distress over the last five years;
- (b) whether Government has undertaken any measures to alleviate the financial distress among airlines in order to prevent them from adopting practices like increasing passenger fares; and
- (c) if so, the details of measures initiated thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

Minister of State in the Ministry of CIVIL AVIATION (GEN. (DR) V. K. SINGH (RETD))

- (a): Details of the domestic airlines that have exited from aviation market over the last 5 years are at Annexure-I. No such information in respect of international airlines is maintained.
- (b) & (c): Government has taken various initiatives to support the aviation industry. The initiatives taken include:
- I) The matter of reduction in Value Added Tax (VAT) on Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF) was taken up with the State Governments/UT Administrations. As a result, VAT on ATF has been reduced from 28% by 19 States/ UTs in the range of 1-4% and by four other States in the range of 5 to 18%
- II) Goods and Services Tax on (GST) rate has been reduced from 18% to 5 % for domestic Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) services.
- III) Government has approved Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) to aviation sector. Based on the industry demand, the scope of ECLGS has been enhanced to provide credit support to these companies

upto 100% of their total credit outstanding (both fund based and non-fund based outstanding) as on reference dates, subject to a cap of Rs. 1500 crore per borrower, whichever is lower.
