**JAL SHAKTI ABHIYAN: CATCH THE RAIN PROGRAMME**

1701. DR. SASMIT PATRA

Will the Minister of **JAL SHAKTI** be pleased to state:

- (a) the target set and the status of implementation of the Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain programme, intervention-wise and State-wise;
- (b) the funds allocated and utilized under the programme, State-wise and district-wise, for the State of Odisha;
- (c) the achievements of the programme in Odisha, district-wise; and
- (d) the measures taken by Government to ensure the safety and maintenance of rainwater harvesting infrastructure created under the programme?

**ANSWER**

**THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI**

(SHRI BISHWESWAR TUDU)

(a) Jal Shakti Abhiyan (JSA) was started in 2019, covering 1592 blocks out of 2836 blocks in 256 water stressed districts. JSA could not be implemented in 2020 due to restrictions imposed by Covid 19 pandemic and Ministry of Jal Shakti implemented 'Catch the Rain' (CTR) campaign. Ever since it was launched as "Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain" Campaign in 2021, it has become an annual feature and has been implemented every year i.e. in 2021, 2022, 2023, covering all rural and urban areas in all the districts across the country. There are no defined targets under this campaign and the State Governments are encouraged to undertake as many works as possible aimed at water conservation. As per the information available on JSA:CTR portal ([jsactr.mowr.gov.in](http://jsactr.mowr.gov.in)), the status of implementation of JSA: CTR Intervention-wise and State-wise is at **Annexure I**. Under JSA: CTR, 661 Jal Shakti Kendras (JSKs) have also been set up across the country along with 30 JSKs in the State of Odisha so far. Preparation of district water conservation plans under JSA: CTR has been completed by 518 districts across the country along with 22 districts in the State of Odisha so far.

(b) Funds spent under the JSA: CTR Campaigns is inter-sectoral convergence of various development programmes/schemes of Central and State Governments. However, financial assistance of Rs. 2.00 lakh is released to each district for GIS mapping of water bodies and preparation of district water conservation plans under JSA: CTR. The state-wise details of funds released under JSA: CTR for GIS mapping of water bodies and preparation of district water conservation plans is at **Annexure II** & the district-wise details of funds released under JSA: CTR for the State of Odisha is at **Annexure III**.

(c) As per the information available on JSA:CTR portal ([jsactr.mowr.gov.in](http://jsactr.mowr.gov.in)), the district-wise achievements of JSA: CTR in Odisha is at **Annexure IV**.

(d) JSA: CTR campaign implemented by National Water Mission (NWM) has 5 focused interventions in which the first intervention is on rainwater harvesting and conservation. This intervention among all other things also includes renovation of traditional and other water bodies/ tanks, removal of encroachments of tanks/lakes, desilting of tanks to increase their storage capacity, removal of obstructions in their channels, repairs to traditional step wells and other RWHS, use defunct bores/unused wells to recharge aquifers, rejuvenation of small rivers and rivulets, revival of wetlands and protection of flood-banks.
