Skill Development Centres in Punjab

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Skill Development Centres (SDCs) currently functioning in Punjab with Government support;
- (b) the number of SDCs got shut down in Punjab in last five years;
- (c) the details of fund allocated and fund released under various schemes of the Ministry in last three years, year-wise, scheme-wise, State-wise and district-wise for Punjab;
- (d) the number of people who got employed through different courses of PMKVY from Punjab in last five years, year-wise, course-wise, district-wise; and
- (e) the details of targets given, fund allocated and released to Punjab Skill Development mission in the last three years, year-wise?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

(SHRI DHARMENDRA PRADHAN)

(a) Under the Govt. of India's Skill India Mission (SIM), the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) delivers skill, re-skill and up-skill training through an extensive network of skill development centres /institutes under various schemes, viz. Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Sikhshan Sansthan (JSS), National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) and Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), to all the sections of the society across the country. The SIM aims at enabling youth of India to get future ready & industry ready skills. Under these schemes, Training Centres are set up by private/public organizations on need base to impart training across the country. There are 22 Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendras (PMKKS), 2 JSSs, 350 ITIs (Govt. and Private) and 717 NAPS establishments engaging apprentices in the State of Punjab.

(b) During the last five years, 2 PMKKS have been surrendered and 32 ITIs de-affiliated in the state of Punjab.

(c) to (e) Under the Schemes of MSDE funds are released to States only and there is no provision for releasing funds directly to districts. State/UT wise funds released under PMKVY, JSS and NAPS during last three years (2020-21 to 2022-23) are given at **Annexure-I**. Day to day administration as well as financial control in respect of ITIs lies with the respective State Governments/Union Territory Administrations.

All the skilling schemes of MSDE are demand-driven and joining such courses is a voluntary decision on the part of the potential trainees. Further, only in the case of Short Term Training Component of PMKVY, placement of trained candidates is specifically tracked. District and job role wise number of candidates reported placed under PMKVY from state of Punjab during last five years is given at **Annexure-II**.
