(a) Since 2018, India has entered into Open Sky Agreement with 4 countries namely Australia, Maldives, Canada and New Zealand.

(b) National Civil Aviation Policy, 2016 provides for Open Sky Agreement on reciprocal basis with SAARC countries and countries with territory located entirely beyond a 5000 km radius from New Delhi. Entering into 'Open Sky' Agreement with foreign countries is a continuous process. The Open Sky approach is pursued keeping in mind overall interests of the Indian Civil Aviation sector and enhanced connectivity.
