- (a) whether it is a fact that new medical colleges have been set up by Government in the country during the last three years;
- (b) if so, the details of new colleges set up in the last three years, State-wise; and
- (c) the amount of budget sanctioned for the new medical colleges set up by Government, State-wise and year-wise details thereof?

(a) to (c): The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare administers a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) for 'Establishment of new medical colleges attached with existing district/referral hospitals' with preference to underserved areas and aspirational districts, where there is no existing Government or private medical college with fund sharing between the Centre and State Governments in the ratio of 90:10 for North Eastern and Special Category States and 60:40 for others.

Under the Scheme, 157 Government medical colleges have been approved in three phases, Out of these, 108 medical colleges have become functional. The state-wise and year-wise details of medical colleges approved under the scheme and funds released to these colleges in last three years are at annexure.

In addition to this, under the Central Sector Scheme for setting up of new AIIMS, 22 AIIMS have been approved. Undergraduate courses have started in 19 of these.
