## ENHANCEMENT OF COMPETITIVENESS IN INDIAN CAPITAL GOODS SECTOR

#### 756. SMT. DARSHANA SINGH:

Will the Minister of Heavy Industries be pleased to state:

- (a) the details regarding the utilisation of the financial outlay, budgetary support, and Industry Contribution, emphasising the distribution across the components of Phase II in the Scheme aimed at enhancing competitiveness in the capital goods sector;
- (b) the status of projects that have been approved under Phase-II of the Scheme for Enhancement of Competitiveness in the Indian Capital Goods Sector;
- (c) the number of approved projects and their total project cost; and
- (d) the funds released for these projects during the fiscal year 2022-23?

#### **ANSWER**

#### THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR HEAVY INDUSTRIES

### (SHRI KRISHAN PAL GURJAR)

(a): Ministry of Heavy Industries notified the Scheme for "Enhancement of Competitiveness in The Indian Capital Goods Sector- Phase-II" with financial outlay of Rs. 1207 crores, budgetary support of Rs.975 crore and minimum Industry Contribution of Rs.232 crores. There are five main components under the Scheme. The component wise budgetary details are as under:

- (d): A total of Rs. 197.4998 crores was released by MHI for the projects under CG Scheme Phase 2 during the Fiscal Year 2022-23.

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
