Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of number of rural households provided with drinking water connections so far under the 'Har Ghar Nal ka Jal' scheme implemented by Government, State-wise;
- (b) the details of targets under the scheme for the current and the next financial years; and
- (c) the funds allocated and actually spent under the scheme since its inception, the yearwise details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI (SHRI RAJEEV CHANDRASEKHAR)

(a) to (c) Government of India is committed to make provision for safe & potable tap water supply in adequate quantity, of prescribed quality and on a regular & long-term basis to all rural households in the country. Towards this end, the Government of India launched the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), to be implemented in partnership with states, in August 2019. Drinking Water is a state subject, and hence, the responsibility of planning, approval, implementation, operation, and maintenance of drinking water supply schemes, including those under the Jal Jeevan Mission, lies with State/UT Governments. The Government of India supports the States by providing technical and financial assistance.

Significant progress has been made in the country since the launch of Jal Jeevan Mission, towards enhancing access to tap water to rural households. At the start of Jal Jeevan Mission in August 2019, only 3.23 Crore (16.8%) rural households were reported to have tap water connections. So far, as reported by States/ UTs as on 07.12.2023, around 10.53 Crore additional rural households have been provided with tap water connections under JJM. Thus, as on 07.12.2023, out of 19.24 Crore rural households in the country, approximately 13.76 Crore (71.51%) households are reported to have tap water supply in their homes, and the remaining 5.48 Crore are likely to be covered within the Mission Period. State/ UT-wise details of tap connections are **annexed**.

Further, the year-wise details central fund allocated, drawn and utilization reported by the States/UTs under Jal Jeevan Mission is as follows:
