CAPACITY BUILDING OF WORKERS IN TEXTILE SECTOR

160. SHRI RAJENDRA GEHLOT:

Will the Minister of TEXTILES be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of skill development programmes and functional textile training centres launched for capacity building of workers in the textile sector in the country, State-wise;
- (b) the number of beneficiaries under Integrated Skill Development Scheme (ISDS) and Samarth Scheme especially in the State of Rajasthan and other States during the last three years and the current year; and
- (c) whether any new scheme in the textile sector is under consideration for small towns, if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR TEXTILES (SMT. DARSHANA JARDOSH)

- (a): Ministry of Textiles implemented the umbrella skilling scheme of Integrated Skill Development Scheme (ISDS) during 2010-2018 for skill development and capacity building of workers across textile value chain. In further continuation, the revamped skilling scheme of Samarth-Scheme for Capacity Building in Textile Sector (SCBTS) was launched in 2017-18. Samarth provides demand driven, placement oriented National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) compliant skilling programme to supplement the efforts of the industry in creating jobs in the organized textile and related sectors, covering the textile value chain, excluding Spinning and Weaving in organized sector, through entry level and upskilling courses. Under Samarth, a total of 2,55,771 beneficiaries have been trained. State/UT-wise details of training centres functional in the country under Samarth scheme are given in **Annexure-I**.
- **(b):** ISDS was operational up to 2017-18 and a total of 11.14 lakh beneficiaries were trained. Thereafter, Samarth was launched. The details of number of beneficiaries under Samarth during the last three years and the current year, State/UT-wise including Rajasthan are given in **Annexure-II**.
- (c): Ministry of Textiles is implementing Samarth Scheme on Pan India basis, including small towns. Ministry of Textiles is implementing various schemes viz, Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme, Pradhan Mantri Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel (PM MITRA), Amended Technology Upgradation Scheme (ATUFS), Silk Samagra, National Handloom Development Programme, National Handicraft Development Programme, Integrated Wool Development Programme (IWDP), National Technical Textile Mission (NTTM), Scheme for Integrated Textile Parks (SITP) etc. catering exclusively for development of textile sector in the country.
