CAT III B AND CAT III C RUNWAYS

199. SMT PRIYANKA CHATURVEDI

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:-

(a) the reasons for Government beginning maintenance work on one of the two CAT III-B runways only in September, 2023 in the IGI Airport knowing that it would not be ready for winter;

(b) the reasons for this delay;

(c) the number of pilots in the country trained to land in CAT III-B runways;(d) whether Government is aware of the fact that the country does not have a single CAT III-C runway, if so, the reasons for the same; and

(e) the number of flights delayed and diverted in the last five years due to extreme weather conditions?

ANSWER

Minister of State in the Ministry of CIVIL AVIATION (GEN. (DR) V. K. SINGH (RETD))

(a) & (b) : Delhi International Airport Limited (DIAL), operator of IGI Airport, Delhi requested for resurfacing and Aeronautical Ground Lighting (AGL) upgradation work of Runway 10/28 from 11.09.2023. The work was planned to be completed by 15.12.2023. However, DIAL could not complete the runway resurfacing work in time, for which following reasons have been intimated:

(i) Disruption in raw material supply chain for civil works due to implementation of Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP-IV) in Delhi area.

(ii) Delayed supply of imported lights by the specialised agency [Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) of existing AGL setup) due to supply chain complexities.

(iii) Originally supplied signage offered some technical issues and needed to be replaced impacting the project timelines.

(iv) Software configuration issues including framework for different logics as per operational requirements between CMS software and newly installed Individual Lamp Control and Monitoring System (ILCMS) complaint hardware setup. (v) Duct blockage and other unexpected challenges observed during cable laying process requiring re-work at multiple locations.

(c) : As per data received from various scheduled airlines, total 6191 number of pilots are trained to land in CAT III-B runways, as on December 2023.

(d) : There are 6 airports in the country, where Runway is certified for CAT III operations.

(e) : The number of flights delayed in the last 5 years is at Annexure
