Jal Jeevan Mission targets

240. Shri Mohammed Nadimul Haque:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of villages that have achieved Functional Household Tap Connection in Jammu and Kashmir;
- (b) the total number of villages that have achieved Functional Household Tap Connection in Ladakh;
- (c) whether the Jal Jeevan Mission has achieved its initial national and State-wise targets by the year 2024, if so, the details thereof, State-wise; and
- (d) if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

(a) to (d) Government of India is committed to make provision for safe & potable tap water supply in adequate quantity, of prescribed quality and on a regular & long-term basis to all rural households in the country. Towards this end, the Government of India launched the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), to be implemented in partnership with states, in August 2019. Drinking Water is a state subject, and hence, the responsibility of planning, approval, implementation, operation, and maintenance of drinking water supply schemes, including those under the Jal Jeevan Mission, lies with State/UT Governments. The Government of India supports the States by providing technical and financial assistance.

Significant progress has been made in the country since the launch of Jal Jeevan Mission, towards enhancing access to tap water for rural households. At the start of Jal Jeevan Mission in August 2019, only 3.23 Crore (16.8%) rural households were reported to have tap water connections. So far, as reported by States/ UTs as on 31.01.2024, around 10.97 Crore additional rural households have been provided with tap water connections under JJM. Thus, as on 31.01.2024, out of 19.24 Crore rural households in the country, approximately 14.21 Crore (73.76%) households are reported to have tap water supply in their homes. State/UT wise details are at **Annex-I**

Similarly, at the time of announcement of Jal Jeevan Mission in August 2019, 5.75 lakh (30.70%) and 0.01 lakh (3.47%) rural households in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh were reported to have tap water connections. Since then, an additional 8.58 lakh and 0.36 lakh rural households in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh respectively have been provided with tap water connections over last four years under JJM. Thus, as on 31.01.2024, out of 18.72 lakh and 0.41 lakh rural households in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh, around 14.33 lakh (75.3%) and 0.38 lakh (89.9%) households in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh are reported to have tap water supply in their homes.

As reported on JJM-IMIS, 821 villages in Jammu and Kashmir and 150 villages in Ladakh are reported to have 100% coverage.
