CSR FUNDING FOR PROJECTS IN TAMIL NADU

QUESTION

351 Shri K.R.N. Rajeshkumar:

Will the Minister of Corporate Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the works/projects completed under the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) in the country, State and sector-wise;
- (b) the details of the companies provided assistance and the works/projects completed under the CSR in Tamil Nadu, district and sector-wise;
- (c) the number of beneficiaries of such CSR projects/works in Tamil Nadu, district-wise; and
- (d) the details and the names of the projects which have not been completed under CSR in Tamil Nadu along with the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

(a) to (d): The broad framework for Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) has been provided under Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act'), Schedule VII of the Act and Companies (CSR Policy) Rules, 2014. All data related to CSR filed by companies in MCA21 registry is available in public domain at www.csr.gov.in.

Pursuant to the Companies (Amendment) Act, 2019 and Companies (CSR Policy) Amendment Rules 2021, the CSR projects undertaken by companies have been classified as 'ongoing projects' and 'other than ongoing projects' w.e.f. 22 January 2021. In case of an ongoing project, the company is required to transfer the unspent amount to a special account of the company i.e 'Unspent CSR Account', within 30 days from the end of financial year and spend the same in pursuance of its CSR policy within the next three financial years from the date of such transfer. After lapse of three financial years, the amount remaining unspent, if any, is required to be transferred to any Fund mentioned in Schedule VII of the Act. Further, the present CSR filing does not capture the beneficiary-wise details of the CSR projects of the companies.

Furthermore, on the basis of filings made by the companies in the MCA21 registry, the state-wise details of ongoing projects for the F.Y. 2021-22 including Tamil Nadu is at Annexure-I.

In case of other than ongoing projects, the company is required to transfer the unspent CSR amount to any of the Funds mentioned in Schedule VII of the Act within a period of six months from the end of the financial year.

On the basis of the filings made by the companies in the MCA21 registry, State/UT-wise and Development sector-wise details of CSR spent by all the companies during last three Financial Years (FY) 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22 are at Annexure – II & III respectively. Further, the District-wise and Development sector-wise CSR spent by all the companies in the state of Tamil Nadu during last three FY 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22 are at Annexure - IV & V respectively. For the FY 2022-23, the companies are required to file the CSR details on or before 31.03.2024.

Moreover, every eligible company has to constitute a CSR Committee comprising three or more directors. The Committee shall formulate and recommend the CSR policy which indicate the activities to be undertaken by the company in area or subject specified in Schedule VII. The Board of the company plan, decide, execute and monitor the CSR activities of the company based on the recommendation of its CSR Committee.
