#### FUNDS ALLOTTED TO STATES UNDER VARIOUS SCHEMES

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the funds allotted to the States of Kerala, Maharashtra and Assam under various schemes of the Ministry during the period of 2019-24 are higher as compared to recent past;
- (b) if so, the allotment of funds thereof annually from 2019-2024;
- (c) whether Government has approved any special projects in Health and Family Welfare for the States of Kerala, Maharashtra and Assam from 2019 to 2024; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof annually during the period 2019-2024?

## ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

(a) to (d): Ministry of Health and Family Welfare through various centrally sponsored schemes and central sector schemes supplements the efforts of the States/UTs in the healthcare sector. Various Central Sector Schemes and Centrally Sponsored Schemes are implemented with separate budget lines for each component of the schemes under this Ministry. Government spending for these schemes are made for best output as per quarterly expenditure plan. The scheme wise details are as follows:

**National Health Mission:** Under National Health Mission there is an overall increase of 30%, 31% and 57% in release of Central Share during the five year period of 2019-24 in comparison to past five year period from 2014-19 in the State of Kerala, Maharashtra and Assam respectively. PMSSY: Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY) which aims at correcting regional imbalances in the availability of affordable tertiary healthcare services and to augment facilities for quality medical education in the country. The Scheme has two components, namely, (i) Setting up of All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS); and (ii) Up-gradation of existing Government Medical Colleges/Institutions (GMCIs). Up-gradation of GMCIs under PMSSY broadly involves construction of Super Specialty Block (SSB) and/or Trauma Centre / or other facilities and/or procurement of medical equipment. Further, in Maharashtra, One AIIMS has been approved at Nagpur at a cost of Rs. 1,577 crore, which is functional and in Assam, one new AIIMS has been approved at Guwahati at a cost of Rs 1,123 Crore of which 95% construction work completed. MBBS classes, OPD services and IPD services operationalized under the PMSSY. Details of funds released for the projects approved under PMSSY in Kerala, Maharashtra and Assam from 2019-20 to 2023-24 are at Annexure-I.
