Regulating EdTech sector

499 SHRI RAJEEV SHUKLA:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of measures being taken by Government to regulate the EdTech sector in the country;
- (b) the progress made in this regard;
- (c) whether Government is taking/intends to take measures to deal with the cyber threats as well as privacy related concerns in this respect; and
- (d) if so, the proposed measures to be taken in this respect?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (DR. SUBHAS SARKAR)

(a) to (d) To ensure safeguard of interest of various stakeholders with respect to services offered by EdTech sector, Ministry of Education had issued a public advisory on 23rd December, 2021 which includes dos and don'ts for the stakeholders. It has also reiterated that the legal provisions for ecommerce firms (which were notified by the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution (Department of Consumer Affairs)) that apply to all companies including EdTech. To regulate standards of instruction for the grant of degrees at the undergraduate and post graduate levels and grant of post graduate diploma, through Open and Distance Learning mode and Online mode, UGC has notified University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations, 2020 on 04th September, 2020. Details of regulations are available at https://www.ugc.ac.in/pdfnews/221580.pdf. These regulations prohibit franchise arrangement with private sector and the ownership of offering online programmes shall be that of HEIs only.
