**UNDERUTILIZATION OF FUNDS**

314. SMT. SULATA DEO:  
SHRI NIRANJAN BISHI:

Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the demand and actual expenditure by the Ministry in the last five years;
- (b) whether Government is aware that there has been an underutilization of funds in the last five years; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof, if not, the reasons therefor?

**ANSWER**

(a) to (c). For better implementation and efficient monitoring, all schemes of the Ministry have been clubbed into three verticals, viz. (1) Saksham Anganwadi & Poshan 2.0 for improving nutrition and health indicators in the country (2) Mission Shakti, for safety, protection and empowerment of women; and (3) Mission Vatsalya, for protection, care and welfare of vulnerable children.

The details of demand and actual expenditure under the schemes of the Ministry during the last five years are **annexed**.

All the schemes implemented by the Ministry are Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) and are implemented by the States/Union Territories (UTs). The budget allocation for these schemes is finalised based on inputs received from the States/UTs regarding their requirements and the trend of expenditure over the previous years. Further, under CSS, States/UTs are required to contribute their corresponding share of funds, incur a minimum of 75% expenditure of total available funds and submit the Statement of Expenditure (SoE) and Utilization Certificates to enable the Ministry to release the central share of funds. Wherever the above conditions are not met, release of the central share gets affected/delayed resulting in unspent balance at the end of the financial year.

Nevertheless, smooth functioning and proper implementation of the schemes, including utilization of funds, is reviewed periodically through meetings/video conferences with States/UTs and field visits. The Central Government has been persistent in its efforts to ensure optimum utilisation of funds towards the aforementioned cause.
