**STRENGTHENING BSNL AND MAKING IT DEBT- FREE**

**329 # SMT. MAHUA MAJI:**

Will the Minister of *Communications* be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL), a very important institution of the Government, is heavily debt-ridden while private companies are making profits;
- (b) whether Government has formulated any plan to strengthen BSNL and make it debt-free;
- (c) if so, the detailed description of the said plan along with the time by when BSNL would become debt-free; and
- (d) if not, the reasons therefor?

- (a) Debt position of BSNL vis-à-vis other operators:

- (b) & (d) Government has taken various steps for revival of BSNL
- In 2019, first revival package amounting to around Rs. 69 Thousand Crore that brought down the operating costs of BSNL/MTNL.
  - In 2022, revival package amounting to around Rs. 1.64 Lakh Crore was given. It focused on infusing fresh capital, restructuring debt, viability gap funding for rural telephony etc.
  - In 2023, Government approved the allotment of 4G/5G spectrum to BSNL with the total outlay of around Rs. 89 Thousand Crore.

As a result of these packages, BSNL has started earning operating profits from F.Y. 2020-21.
