## RAJYA SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 485 TO BE ANSWERED ON THE 26/07/2024

#### AVERAGE INCOME OF FARMERS

485. SHRI IMRAN PRATAPGARHI: DR. SYED NASEER HUSSAIN: SHRI HARIS BEERAN:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) the average monthly income of farmers across various states in the country;
- (b) whether Government have any data about number of agricultural households in the country who are in debt, if so, the details there of since 2019, State-wise and year-wise;
- (c) the details of schemes being implemented by Government to increase farmers' income and the impact thereof; and
- (d) the manner in which Government plans to increase agricultur3al income and make agriculture a profitable occupation in the country?

#### **ANSWER**

- (a) & (b): The National Sample Survey Office (NSSO), Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) conducted a Situation Assessment Survey (SAS) of Agricultural Households during NSS 77<sup>th</sup> round (January, 2019 December, 2019) with reference to the agricultural year July, 2018- June, 2019 in the rural areas of the country. As per result of SAS, statewise the average monthly income per agricultural household during 2018-19 is given at Annexure-I and state-wise percentage of indebted agricultural households during the same period is given at Annexure-II.
- (c) & (d): Government has adopted and implemented several policies, reforms, developmental programmes and schemes for achieving higher incomes for the farmers directly or indirectly. The

unprecedented enhanced budgetary provisions have been made to facilitate the following efforts of the Government:

- 1. Income support to farmers through PM KISAN
- 2. Pradhan MantriFasalBimaYojana (PMFBY)
- 3. Institutional credit for agriculture sector
- 4. Fixing of Minimum Support Price (MSP) at one-and-a half times the cost of production
- 5. Promotion of organic farming in the country
- 6. Per Drop More Crop
- 7. Micro Irrigation Fund
- 8. Promotion of Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs)
- 9. National Beekeeping and Honey Mission (NBHM)
- 10. Agricultural Mechanization
- 11. Providing Soil Health Cards to farmers
- 12. Setting up of National Agriculture Market (e-NAM) extension Platform
- 13.Launch of the National Mission for Edible Oils Oil Palm
- 14. Agri Infrastructure Fund (AIF)
- 15.Improvement in farm produce logistics, Introduction of Kisan Rail
- 16. Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH) Cluster Development

### Programme

- 17. Creation of a Start-up Eco system in agriculture and allied sector
- 18. Achievement in Export of Agri and Allied Agri- Commodities
- 19. Central sector Scheme Namo Drone Didi

The above efforts have led to a rise in the Gross Value Added of the agriculture and allied sector, registering an average annual growth rate of 4 percent over the past five years. Implementation of these schemes has yielded remarkable results towards augmenting the income of the farmers. As part of the 'Azadika Amrit Mahotsav', Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) has released a book, which contains compilation of success stories of 75,000 farmers out of innumerable successful farmers who have increased their income more than two times.
