AB-PMJAY IN KARNATAKA

922. SHRI NARAYANA KORAGAPPA:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (ABPMJAY) is the largest health insurance scheme in the world which aims at providing a health cover of ₹ Five Lakh per family per year, if so, the details thereof, State-wise and in Karnataka State, district-wise; and
- (b) whether there would be expansion of AB-PMJAY covering all individuals aged seventy years and above, if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI PRATAPRAO JADHAV)

- (a): Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) is the largest publicly funded health assurance scheme in the world, which provides health cover of Rs. 5 lakhs per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization to approximately 55 crore beneficiaries corresponding to 12.34 crore families, constituting the bottom 40% of India's population. States/UTs implementing AB-PMJAY have further expanded the beneficiary base at their own cost. State/UT-wise details of number of eligible families under the scheme are at Annexure-I. District-wise details of number of eligible families in the State of Karnataka are at Annexure-II.
- (b): Presently, all members of the eligible families irrespective of age are covered under Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana.
