Government of India (GOI) organises the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra every year between June and September, through the two official routes of Lipulekh Pass (since 1981) in Uttarakhand and Nathu La Pass (since 2015) in Sikkim. The Yatra has not take place since 2020 following the COVID-19 outbreak and the subsequent non-renewal of Yatra arrangements by the Chinese side.

Indian side has taken up the issue of resumption of Kailash Mansarovar Yatra with the Chinese side in its diplomatic engagements. Most recently, External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar met China's Foreign Minister, Mr. Wang Yi on the sidelines of G-20 Summit on 18 November 2024 in Rio de Janerio. The resumption of the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra was discussed in the meeting.
