MSME ROLE IN KARNATAKA'S ECONOMY

109. SHRI G.C. CHANDRASHEKHAR:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government has implemented specific measures to support Karnataka's silk and textile Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), which are key employment providers, particularly post-COVID-19, if so, the details thereof, including PMEGP funding, which supported over 1,200 MSMEs in Karnataka;

(b) whether initiatives have been introduced for rural MSMEs in Karnataka, promoting local crafts like Channapatna toys and Ilkalsarees, especially under SFURTI's cluster funding; and

(c) whether there are recent provisions for digitalization and global access for Karnataka's MSMEs, including assistance under ECLGS, which provided ₹6,000 crore in support, if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (SUSHRI SHOBHA KARANDLAJE)

(a): Government has implemented specific measures to support Karnataka's silk and textile industries. Khadi Institutions registered and assisted by Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) are engaged in production and sales of Khadi (Cotton Khadi, Woollen Khadi, Silk Khadi, Muslin Khadi and Polyvastra) and thereby providing employment opportunities for rural Khadi artisans through implementation of the Scheme, Khadi Vikas Yojana (KVY).

2,945 number of Khadi Institutions and 4,98,594 Khadi artisans are engaged in the Khadi Sector in the country, out of which 265 Khadi Institutions are engaged and 27,708 Khadi artisans are from Karnataka State.

Ministry of MSME, through Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) as nodal agency, is implementing Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), for assisting entrepreneurs in setting up of new units in the non-farm sector. It aims to provide employment opportunities to traditional artisans/ rural and urban unemployed youth at their doorstep.

Under the scheme, maximum cost of project is Rs. 50 lakh in the Manufacturing sector and Rs. 20 lakh in the Service sector. General Category beneficiaries can avail of Margin Money (MM) subsidy of 25% of the project cost in rural areas and 15% in urban areas. For beneficiaries belonging to Special Categories such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, OBCs, Minorities, Women, Ex-servicemen, Physically Handicapped, Trans genders, beneficiaries belonging to Northeastern Region, Hill and Border areas, and Aspirational Districts, the Margin Money subsidy is 35% in rural areas and 25% in urban area.

Since 2018-19, existing PMEGP/MUDRA enterprises are also supported based on past good performances with 2nd loan for upgradation and expansion. Under 2ndloan, maximum project cost admissible for Margin Money (MM) subsidy under Manufacturing sector is Rs. 1.00 Crore and for Service sector, it is Rs. 25 Lakh. Eligible subsidy for 2nd loan for all categories is 15% of project cost (20% for NER & Hill States).

Performance of PMEGP from FY 2020-21 to FY 2024-25 across the country and for Karnataka State are placed at Annexure-I.

(b): Ministry of MSME has launched a cluster based scheme viz. Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI) with an aim to help traditional industries become more productive, profitable and capable for generating sustainable employment for traditional industries artisans across the country, including Karnataka. SFURTI is a scheme to organize artisans of traditional sectors into collectives for manufacturing value added products and provide sustainable employment.

A total of 513 clusters have been approved under SFURTI since 2015-16, with a total Government of India assistance of Rs. 1,334 crores. Out of these clusters, 376 are functional, benefitting 2.20 lakh artisans and 137 clusters are under implementation as on 19-11-2024.

Financial Assistance provided under the Scheme: -

- Rs. 2.5 cr. for Regular clusters up to 500 artisans
- Rs. 5.0 cr. for Major clusters with more than 500 artisans

Total 29 clusters, including Channapatna Lacware Toys Cluster, have been approved in Karnataka state with GoI assistance of Rs. 81.07 cr, benefitting 18,952 artisans. Details of the approved clusters in Karnataka is placed at Annexure-II.

(c): Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) was launched in May, 2020 as part of Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan to support eligible Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) and business enterprises in meeting their operational liabilities and restarting their businesses in context of the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. This scheme covered all the sectors of the economy. Under ECLGS, 100% guarantee was provided to Member lending Institutions (MLIs) in respect to the credit facility extended by them to eligible borrowers. In view of the evolving situations in the light of Covid waves and its effect on the various sectors of the economy, scope of the scheme was extended in the form of additional credit and expanded scope of eligible borrowers, by the introduction of ECLGS 2.0, 3.0 and 4.0 as well as changes from time to time. The scheme was valid till 31.3.2023. MSME data for the Textile Industry in Karnataka under the ECLGS is placed at Annexure -III.

Further, Ministry of MSME has made following provisions for digitalization and global access for MSMEs of the country: -

- i. Ministry of MSME has launched a portal, Udyam Assist Platform (UAP), for bringing Informal Micro Enterprises in the formal ambit which helped the registered IMEs to avail the benefits of Priority Sector Lending.
- ii. Ministry of MSME has launched Samadhaan Portal for filing of grievances and monitoring of outstanding dues to the MSEs from the buyers of goods and services.
- iii. Launching of an online Portal "Champions" in June, 2020 to cover many aspects of egovernance including redressing grievances and handholding of MSMEs.
- iv. Government vide notification no. S.O. 4845(E) dated 07.11.2024 instructed CPSEs and all companies with the turnover of Rs. 250 Crore or more to get themselves on-boarded on the Trade Receivables Discounting System (TReDS), an electronic platform for facilitating the discounting of trade receivables of MSMEs through multiple financiers.
- v. New revised criteria for classification of MSMEs, based on Investment and Turnover, to widen the ambit of the MSME sector.
- vi. "Udyam Registration (UR)" for MSMEs, for Ease of Doing Business.

State-wise total MSMEs registered under UR & UAP are placed at Annexure-IV.
