SHORTAGE OF STAFF IN CENTRAL GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT AND PSUS

2048. SHRI JAVED ALI KHAN:

Will the **PRIME MINISTER** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government is aware that every Ministry/Department/PSU under Central Government is facing staff shortage upto 30 to 60 per cent due to nil recruitment or very less recruitment since 2019;
- (b) if so, the details of vacancies and sanctioned strength of officers and staff in Central Government, Ministry/Department/PSU-wise;
- (c) whether Government is aware that staffs of Central Government are overburdened by work pressure due to nil or very few recruitment; and
- (d) if so, by when around ten lakh vacancies in Central Government would be filled up?

ANSWER

(a) to (d): Occurrence and filling up of vacant posts in various Ministries/ Departments is a continuous process. Ministries/ Departments of the Central Government have been directed, from time to time, to fill up the vacant posts in a time bound manner. The details of vacancies and recruitments are maintained by the respective Ministry/ Department/PSU etc. under Central Government.

Vacant posts are being filled up in mission mode, through Rozgar Melas launched by Hon'ble Prime Minister on 22nd October, 2022. 13 Rozgar Melas have been held at Central level in 40-45 cities across various States/ Union Territories. Several lakh appointment letters have been distributed in the Rozgar Melas by various Ministries/ Departments, their attached organisations and CPSUs etc.
