**ACTION TAKEN ON VARIOUS DEMANDS UNDER NORTHEAST FRONTIER

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of steps taken by Government for running Silchar-Mahisasan train twice a day on public demand;
- (b) the details of steps taken by Government in extending service of Dullavchera-Guwahati train up to New Delhi; and
- (c) the details of steps taken by Government in response to representation from Border Security Force (BSF) Commandant and others for conversion of Patherkandi Station to B-class Station?

(a) to (c) Silchar-Maishashan sector is presently being served by 02 pairs of trains services viz 05681/05682 & 05683/05684 Maishashan- Silchar Passenger (Bi-Weekly). Similarly, Dullabcherra is connected to Guwahati by 15617/15618 Guwahati-Dullabcherra Express while Guwahati is connected to Delhi area by 07 pairs of Mail/Express services. Besides, extension/increase in frequency of train services is an ongoing process on Indian Railways subject to operational feasibility, traffic justification, availability of resources etc.

Further, conversion of stations is an ongoing process on Indian Railways subject to operational requirements.
