2603 DR. JOHN BRITTAS:

Will the Minister of *Education* be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) established during the last five years, State-wise;
- (b) the number of Kendriya Vidyalayas shutdown during the last five years, State-wise and the reasons therefor;
- (c) total sanctioned strength of posts in KVs across the country and the details of current vacancies;
- (d) whether it is a fact that several quotas including MPs' quota have been scrapped with regard to admission in KV;
- (e) if so, the details of the quotas scrapped;
- (f) the number of quotas allowed to be continued including new ones; and
- (g) the number of students intake as per these quotas, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)

- (a) As per information received from Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), 48 KVs under Civil / Defence and 12 KVs under Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) / Project Sector, have been opened and made operational during the last five years and current financial year (i.e. 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22, 2022-23, 2023-24 and 2024-25) across the country. State/UT-wise details are at Annexure-I.
- (b) As per information received from KVS, following 02 KVs were shutdown across the country during the last five years and current year:

(c) The details of total sanctioned posts and vacancy position of teaching and non-teaching staff of KVS, as on 01.11.2024, are as under:-

- (d) & (e) With the increase in discretionary quotas over the years, which were over and above the sanctioned class strength, the management of admission process in KVs had become complicated and was not achieving the aims and objectives on account of increase in Pupil-Teacher Ratio (PTR). Consequently, with a view to rationalizing this and to achieve desired learning outcomes, a number of discretionary quotas/special provisions have been done away with. Accordingly, the discretional quotas/special provisions viz. Hon'ble MP Quota, VMC Chairman's discretionary quota, sponsoring agency guota, children and dependent grandchildren of Hon'ble MPs, children of employees of Ministry of Education, Children of National Awardee Teachers, children and grandchildren of KVS retired employees, grand children of serving KVS employees, children of armed forces recommended through Directorate, Single Girl Child, children of employees of Ministry of External Affairs, Children of employees of Research and Analysis Wing (RAW,) Children of regular Delhi Development Authority employees, Children of Group B & C Employee of Central Police Organisation, were done away with. In order to simplify the admission guidelines, the prioritization categories continue as before. Further, as most of the above mentioned quotas/special provisions were either already being covered under the existing category 1 or 2 or their admission was to be prioritized as per the categorization, these quotas/special provisions were subsumed within the existing priority categories, rather than to add them as additional/special categories.
- (f) The following 10 special provisions are retained including new ones in KVS Admission Guidelines 2024-25:
 - i. Children of serving employees of KVS;
 - ii. Children of Central Government employees who die in harness;
 - iii. Children of recipients of Param Vir Chakra and other medals;
 - iv. Children of recipients of Hon'ble President's Police Medal and others;
 - v. Meritorious Sports Children;
 - vi. Recipients of Rashtrapati Puraskar in Scouts & Guides;
- vii. Recipients of Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar;
- viii. Children who have shown special talent in fine art including Kala Utsav Winners;
- ix. Children orphaned due to Covid-19 under PMCARES Scheme;
- x. Wards of Kashmir Migrants.
- (g) Total 2577 children have been admitted under special provisions in KVs across the country in the current academic session 2024-25. Details are at Annexure -II.
