#### SCHEME TO REDUCE DEPENDENCE ON FERTILISER

#### 2893. DR. SIKANDER KUMAR:

Will the Minister of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of standalone Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) that aims to shift away dependence on fertilisers and chemical inputs in a mission mode;
- (b) whether Bio-input Resource Centres (BRCs) will be setup to provide availability and accessibility to use natural farming inputs for farmers;
- (c) the details of total contribution by Central and State Governments for said project till 15th Finance Commission (2025-26); and
- (d) whether Government has taken steps to establish scientifically supported common standards and farmer friendly certification procedures for naturally grown chemical fee produce in Himachal Pradesh?

#### **ANSWER**

## THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE (SHRI RAMNATH THAKUR)

- (a) to (c): The Union Cabinet on 25th November 2024 has approved the National Mission on Natural Farming (NMNF) as a standalone centrally sponsored scheme with an overall outlay of ₹2481 crore (Government of India share ₹1584 crore and States share ₹897 crore) till the 15th Finance Commission (2025-26). The scheme aims to encourage the use of on-farm made natural farming inputs such as Jeevamrut, Beejamrut etc. Under the scheme, there is provision of 10,000 need based bio-input resource centers to provide easy access to locally produced natural farming inputs thereby reducing dependency of farmers on external markets for purchase of inputs.
- (d): The State Government of Himachal Pradesh has informed that a self-certifying certification system CETARA-NF (Certified Evaluation Tool for Agricultural Resource Analysis-Natural Farming) has been developed under the Prakritik Kheti Khushaal Kisan Yojana (PK3Y). Under this system, categorisation is on the basis of farmers as:
  - i. Antraal one star (farmer has just entered the natural farming system in conversion)
  - ii. Sadharan two-star (farmers practising natural farming and producing with agrichemicals but is dependent on ex-situ inputs)
- iii. Vishisht three-star (Farmers fully practising as per the production tenets of PK3Y).
