GOVERNMENT OF INDIA MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION Rajya Sabha UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. : 657 TO BE ANSWERED ON THE 2nd December 2024 EXPEDITING PENDING WORKS IN AIRPORTS OF TAMIL NADU

657. SHRI R. GIRIRAJAN

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:-

(a) whether Government has received any request letter or plea to expedite the execution of airports in Tamil Nadu viz., Parandur, Vellore airport, Hosur, Neyveli and make them operational, if so, the details thereof;

(b) the reason for the inordinate delay in starting the construction of Parandur airport and completion of work at Vellore and airports;

(c) the appropriate steps taken by Government to expedite the pending works in various airports in Tamil Nadu; and

(d) the approximate time by when the pending works at airports in Tamil Nadu will be completed?

ANSWER

Minister of State in the Ministry of CIVIL AVIATION (Shri Murlidhar Mohol)

(a) to (c): In August 2024, Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) granted Site Clearance approval for development of a Greenfield airport at Parandur, Kancheepuram District to the Tamil Nadu Industrial Development Corporation Limited (TIDCO). Thereafter, application for grant of 'In Principle ' approval has been received from TIDCO.

For Vellore, Neyveli and Salem Airports, Rs. 55.19 crore, Rs. 15.38 crore and Rs. 27.31 crore, respectively have been allocated under the Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) - UDAN (Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik). Development works at all three airports have been

completed and RCS flights have also commenced operations from Salem.

In September 2024, a multi-disciplinary team comprising officials from the Airports Authority of India (AAI) and TIDCO visited Hosur to conduct a pre-feasibility study of four sites for the development of a Greenfield Airport. Further, details of upgradation/modernization work undertaken by AAI at its existing airports in Tamil Nadu along with the project cost are at Annexure-A. Regular monitoring of the progress of upgradation works and removal of bottlenecks in the operationalisation of airports, is done to ensure timely completion.

(d): The timelines for airport projects depends upon various factors such as land acquisition, mandatory clearances, removal of obstacles, financial closure etc. by the respective airport developers.
