- (a) whether initiatives have been undertaken to propel commitment of achieving each of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), if so, details of SDG-wise initiatives thereof;
- (b) the bottlenecks identified by Government in its course of achieving the SDGs and steps taken to address the same, if so, details thereof; and
- (c) whether the State Governments' participation is being ensured in fulfilling these commitments, if so, the details thereof?

(a) & (c) The Government of India and States/Union Territories (UTs) are actively working towards achieving the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The key initiatives include aligning SDG targets with relevant schemes and departments, developing State/UT specific SDG vision documents, expanding the indicator framework to district and block levels, setting up of SDG coordination and acceleration centres to promote localisation and integrating the State/UT budgets with the SDGs. NITI Aayog, as the nodal agency responsible for coordinating efforts on SDGs, provides support to States/UTs in developing the sub-national level monitoring frameworks, which helps them to track the SDGs. It evaluates the performance of States/UTs through the SDG India Index, promotes SDG localisation, and encourages a competitive spirit among States and UTs.

(b) NITI Aayog releases the SDG India Index Report to monitor the progress and challenges of SDGs across States/UTs. The report evaluates the performance of all States and UTs, benchmarking them based on their overall achievements across various goals. The challenges are unique to each State/UT and are addressed by the respective governments.
