- (a) when the updated National Action Plan on Antimicrobial Resistance (NAP-AMR) 2.0 is scheduled for launch and the reasons for any delays in its implementation;
- (b) whether Government plans to establish a dedicated fund to combat antimicrobial resistance, if so, the details thereof, if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (c) whether Government intends to create an integrated platform to address antimicrobial resistance, if so, the details thereof, if not, the reasons therefor?

- (a) The draft National Action Plan on Antimicrobial Resistance (NAP-AMR) 2.0 has been developed in a Whole-of-Government approach in consultation with 17 Ministries and Departments. The updated NAP-AMR is currently in a draft stage.
- (b) No, there is no such proposal under consideration as the stakeholder Departments and Ministries has committed budgeted activity plan including the integration with existing programmes wherever applicable.
- (c) Under NAP AMR 2.0, coordination mechanisms for implementing various activities for antimicrobial resistance within departments of stakeholder Ministries and intersectoral coordination among Ministries, have been incorporated.
