#### NURSING COLLEGES IN THE COUNTRY

\*194 : SHRI NIRANJAN BISHI:

Will the Minister of Health and Family Welfare be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Government and private nursing colleges in the country, State/UT-wise, including Odisha;
- (b) the details of Government and private nursing colleges established in the last three years and the current year, State/UT-wise, including Odisha;
- (c) the steps Government has taken to improve essential amenities and infrastructure in these nursing colleges;
- (d) the criteria for setting up new nursing colleges with necessary infrastructure; and
- (e) whether Government plans to establish Government/private nursing colleges in all districts of Odisha, including Scheduled Areas under the Constitution?

- (a) & (b) The details of the total number of Government and private institutions in the country, State/UT-wise (including Odisha) along with details of the institutions established in last 3 years is at **Annexure-I & II**.
- (c) & (d) The Government has taken the following steps to support establishment of nursing colleges and to support nursing education:
  - i. The Government has approved the Scheme for establishment of 157 new nursing colleges in co-location with the existing medical colleges established since 2014.
  - ii. Under the Central Sector Scheme 'Development of Nursing Services' financial assistance is provided to States/UTs to upgrade Schools of Nursing into Colleges of Nursing.
  - iii. The requirement of land to construct building for School/College of Nursing and Hostel has been relaxed.
  - iv. The requirement of a 100 bedded parent hospital has been relaxed for hilly and tribal areas.
  - v. The student teacher ratio for M.Sc.(N) programme has been relaxed from 1:5 to 1:10
  - vi. Student patient ratio for Nursing Institutions has been relaxed from 1:5 to 1:3
  - vii. Admission for Nursing has been allowed for married candidates.
  - viii. Maximum number of 100 seats for Nursing College will be given to those having parent hospitals with 300 beds without insisting on Medical College.
  - ix. Distance from school to hospital has been relaxed from 15 km to 30 Km. However, for hilly and tribal areas the maximum distance is 50 Km.
  - x. Eligibility Criteria to admission i.e. (Marks) for Diploma and Degree has been relaxed by 5%.
  - xi. Relaxation for opening M.Sc. (N) programme. Super speciality Hospital can start M.Sc. (N) without having under graduate programme.

The minimum standards of Nursing Education with regard to infrastructure, teaching staff, simulation lab etc, is as per the guidelines given in Indian Nursing Council (Revised Regulations and Curriculum For B.Sc. (Nursing) Program, Regulations, 2020) which is available on the website of Indian Nursing Council at the following link:

(e) Under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme for "Augmenting Nursing Education - Establishment of new Colleges of Nursing in co-location with Medical Colleges", 7 Nursing Colleges have been approved in the State of Odisha in the districts of Jajpur, Balasore, Baripada (Mayurbhanj), Balangir, Koraput, Angul and Puri, for which Rs 28 Cr has been released to the State as first installment.
