RENOUNCEMENT OF INDIAN CITIZENSHIP BY CITIZENS

*220#. SHRI NEERAJ DANGI:

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:-

- (a) the number of Indian citizens renouncing their Indian citizenship, year-wise and State-wise during the last two years;
- (b) the details of citizenship taken by the Indians, country-wise;
- (c) whether the main reasons for migration of Indians abroad is related to lack of education/employment and business opportunities;
- (d) if so, the reasons for the failure of the efforts made by Government; and
- (e) the concrete arrangements being made by Government to prevent migration of Indians abroad?

(a) to (e): As per the information available with the Ministry, the number of Indians who gave up their Indian citizenship was 2,16,219 (in 2023) and 2,06,378 (in 2024). For reference purpose, data was 1,22,819 (in 2011); 1,20,923 (in 2012); 1,31,405 (in 2013); 1,29,328 (in 2014); 1,31,489 (in 2015); 1,41,603 (in 2016); 1,33,049 (in 2017); 1,34,561 (in 2018); 1,44,017 (in 2019); 85,256 (in 2020); 1,63,370 (in 2021); 2,25,620 (in 2022). State-wise distribution of people who renounced Indian citizenship for foreign citizenships is not available.

List of the countries whose citizenship Indians acquired is placed at Annexure-I.

The reasons for renouncing Indian citizenship or taking foreign citizenship are personal and known only to the individual. The Government recognizes the potential of the global workplace in an era of knowledge economy. It has also brought about a transformational change in its engagement with Indian diaspora. A successful, prosperous, and influential diaspora is an asset for India. India stands to gain a lot from tapping its diaspora networks and productive utilization of the soft power that comes from having such a flourishing diaspora. The Government's efforts are also aimed at harnessing the diaspora potential to its fullest including through sharing of knowledge and expertise.
