- (c) The current number of ATMs installed in departmental post offices across Odisha is 44;
- (d) The Department has taken the following steps to improve ATM accessibility for the rural population in the State of Odisha:
 - (i) ATM services for Post Office Savings Bank account holders can be availed of not only at ATMs installed in departmental post offices, but also at the ATMs of other banks, and customers of Banks can use ATMs of departmental post offices, due to interoperability of ATMs.
 - (ii) Gramin Dak Sevaks provide cash withdrawal and deposit facility in rural areas through mobile devices of the India Post Payments Bank (IPPB) that act as micro-ATMs for IPPB savings accounts, and this facility is also available for savings accounts of other banks through the Aadhaar enabled Payments System.
