PMBJP in Rajasthan

323 Shri Madan Rathore:

Will the Minister of Chemicals and Fertilizers be pleased to state:

(a) the features of the Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana (PMBJP);

(b) the details of funds sanctioned, allocated and utilized under PMBJP in Rajasthan, so far;

(c) the details of the number of Janaushadhi Kendras set up under PMBJP in Rajasthan, so far;

(d) the details of medicines being provided at these Kendras;

(e) whether there has been growth in the number of Kendras within the country during the last three years; and

(f) whether PMBJP has significantly impacted the lives of common people by providing quality medicines at an affordable price, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) to (f): A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

Statement referred to in reply to RAJYA SABHA STARRED Q. No. 323 for answer on 1.4.2025, raised by Shri Madan Rathore, regarding PMBJP in Rajasthan

The Government launched the Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana (PMBJP) scheme to make quality generic medicines available at affordable prices to all. Under the scheme, dedicated outlets known as Jan Aushadhi Kendras (JAKs) are opened across the country to provide medicines at maximum retail prices that are about 50% to 80% cheaper than those of leading branded medicines in the market. The scheme product basket consists of 2,047 types of medicines and 300 surgicals, medical consumables and devices, covering all major therapeutic groups, such as cardiovascular, anti-cancer, anti-diabetic, anti-infective, anti-allergic and gastro-intestinal medicines and nutraceuticals.

All JAK owners are eligible for incentive at the rate of 20% of the monthly purchases made by them, subject to a monthly ceiling of ₹20,000 and meeting certain conditions such as maintaining stock of specified medicines. In addition, a one-time incentive of ₹2 lakh is provided to outlets opened in the North-Eastern States, Himalayan areas, Island territories and aspirational districts or those opened by women entrepreneurs, ex-servicemen, *divyangjan* and members of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, as support towards furniture, computers, refrigerators and other fixtures.

There is no State- and Union-territory-wise allocation of funds under the scheme.

A total of 486 Jan Aushadhi Kendras (JAKs) have been opened till 28.2.2025 in the State of Rajasthan. District-wise number of JAKs is at Annex.

The progress made in opening of JAKs over the period of three financial years, consisting of the current financial year (till 28.2.2025) and the preceding two financial years, is as under:

The scheme has significantly impacted the lives of common people by providing quality medicines at affordable prices. In the last 10 years, medicines worth ₹6,975 crore in MRP terms have been sold through JAKs, resulting in estimated savings of about ₹30,000 crore to citizens in comparison to the prices of branded medicines. On an average, 10 to 12 lakh persons visit Jan Aushadhi Kendras daily and avail of quality medicines at affordable prices.
